Extension Personnel in a Changing Agri-rural Environment

The developing countries like India are experiencing rapid changes in agricultural and rural environment. Commercialization and diversification have raised hopes but stagnation in productivity and profitability of different enterprises, are posing serious challenges. Sustaining the confidence among farmers has become an issue of concern requiring utmost priority. Productive land under agriculture is shrinking because of growing urbanization and the involvement of potential rural youths in agriculture is declining due to migration to cities. Extension Education methodologies of yesteryear have undergone major changes in terms of concept and application. The issue is alarmingly serious, therefore, requires detailed interaction to explore the ways and means to attract future generation towards agriculture. In view of the context, the following sub-themes have been chosen for deliberation

1. Sectoral and spatial changes in agri-rural environment.
2. Overtime changes in extension methodologies and approaches.
3. Effect of rural migration and urbanization on agriculture.
4. Emerging innovative methodologies/models/cases of extension education.
5. Policy initiatives for improving environment for different stakeholders.
6. Strategies for developing sustainable approaches and models.

Call for Abstracts/Papers :

The participants may submit conceptual, review, research and case study based papers. An abstract of two pages (A-4 size) not exceeding 1000 words should be sent through email: seeagra@gmail.com or **CCD (MS Word)** latest by **November 30, 2008**. Each participant should send not more than two abstracts. The full papers (3000 words) shall be accepted latest by January 10, 2009 along with registration fee. 1. Recognition Award:

Award will be conferred upon five very senior eminent Agricultural Scientists for their outstanding contribution for the promotion of extension science in the country.

2. SEEFellow Award:

Award will be conferred upon five Renowned Agricultural Scientists for their outstanding contribution in their respective fields and TOT.

3. Best Extension Professional Award:

Award will be given to two extension professionals for their outstanding work in transfer of technology and creating impact of the extension programmes among farming community.

4. Young Scientist Award:

Award will be given to four Extension Scientists below the age of 40 years for their outstanding contributions in the field of teaching, research, and extension.

5. Best KVK Professional Award:

Award will be given to two KVK professionals for their outstanding work in transfer of technology and creating impact of the extension programmes among farming community.

6. Ganga Singh Chauhan Memorial Award:

Award will be given to four meritorious Research Scholars in the field of Extension Education.
